Call to Order – Dr. Ilene Wilkins, Chair

Dr. Ilene Wilkins called the meeting to order, Emily Keeney completed Council member roll call. The presence of a quorum was unable to be established with the members in attendance via phone. The Council was unable to vote to approve the March 21, 2023, Meeting Minutes. Three new Early Steps State Office (ESSO) staff members were introduced. Dr. Wilkins asked if there were any updates to the FICCIT appointments. Jessica Meyer shared that there are no updates from the Governor's Office.

<u>Data System Updates</u> – Dusty Stern, BSN, RN, Chief, Bureau of Early Steps and Newborn Screening, Florida Department of Health

Dusty Stern informed attendees that the Data System project moved from the discovery phase into the design phase. There are representatives from different Local Early Steps programs on the project team providing input on the system design to ensure the end user perspective is incorporated. The project vendor has prior Part C data system experience, and new staff member, Laura Gomez, was hired to support with Organizational Change Management. Dusty shared that while some elements are taking longer to complete than anticipated, the time is anticipated to be made up later in the schedule.



<u>Part C Application and Policy Change Updates</u> – *Robert French, Early Steps Program Data Management, Analysis, & Reporting Unit Supervisor, Florida Department of Health*

Robert French shared that ESSO is required to annually submit a Part C application and updated policies to the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP). These were both electronically submitted on May 24, 2023, and have been accepted. A final hard copy submission is due to OSEP August 1, 2023. Robert shared the new budget requested is \$29 million for the 2023-24 fiscal year, up from \$27 million the previous year. The new policies and procedures were publicly noticed for 60 days, including a 30-day period for public comment. There are no significant policy changes, and both the application and proposed policies are available on the Early Steps Program website.

Early Steps State Office Program Updates – Jessica O. Meyer, MSW, Early Steps Program Administrator, Florida Department of Health

Jessica Meyer informed attendees that the OSEP determination letter is anticipated within the next few weeks. Jessica shared the 2021-22 indicator results and that slippage that occurred is thought to be related to COVID recovery in the 2021-22 fiscal year. The full results are available via the Early Steps website under the Program Resources. There was a thorough discussion around what proactive steps could be undertaken by FICCIT to better understand and address any slippage. No specific determination of next steps was made.

Jessica Meyer shared that there are several projects ESSO is supporting, including a marketing campaign to continue with refreshing existing content and developing newer materials such as education guides and videos, as well as the development of a HIPAA compliant referral form for the Early Steps website. Reports on these efforts have received positive feedback from the community. Another new partnership that was recognized was with the Family Network on Disabilities (FND), a parent education organization also funded by the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) as a Parent Training and Information Center, will be developing materials for ESSO, including educational videos and a parent handbook.

ESSO staff are attending conferences and participating in educational panels in the coming months, including recent attendance at Family Café, and upcoming participation in the DCF Conference, One Goal Conference, the OSEP Leadership Conference, and the DaSy Conference.

Public Comment -

Dr. Wilkins shared that ECP received a federal literacy grant focused on ages birth to 12.
